Seven years have passed since VASLan emerged in 2011 as the Third Sector Interface (TSI) supported both by the Scottish Government and South Lanarkshire Council. We take particular pride being recognised by the Scottish Government as one of the best TSIs in the country. As Chair, I want to highlight in my report how the Trustees are focusing on what is essential for a charity not only to survive but to develop its mission.

Most voluntary sector organisations, regardless of size, are faced with competing needs, in a period of diminishing resources and severe political uncertainties. It has been important for the Trustees of VASLan to take

In such a time of change the need for clear and constructive engagement with our Public Sector partners has never been greater. Our Trustees continued to hold faith in what we were doing and maintained a business as usual approach through a significant additional financial investment to the Sector to ensure the TSI remained at the forefront of this engagement, enabling vital conversations to happen.

Bringing people together to enable clear views from service providers within the community to shape how services can really support people effectively to benefit those most in need is really what we are about. Central forums, important dialogue, grappling with the issues, all make vital contributions in shaping and determining the wishes and aspirations of many communities across South Lanarkshire.

It is well recognised that 'too many cooks spoil the broth' and to achieve effective singularity of purpose is particularly challenging but not overwhelming. Our lead in Scotland in the development of the intelligence resource 'Engage, Promote, Involve' is both innovative and ground breaking and is now providing continuous high level information well beyond the scope and imagination of many. The Sector is well equipped with 21st century data and language.

VASLan has played its part in bringing the Sector to the fore across a wide range and diverse set of strategic conversations. Delivering an increasingly important partnership role in helping to attract and secure resources and funding for our local Sector. By adopting a clear and credible locality focus our strategy provides a coordinated accountable approach to assessing and resourcing emerging need, increase Sector stability and provide a richer communications platform for statutory partners to engage with the Third Sector.

That's what we said we will do and that's what we are doing!

STRATEGY UPDATE

In November 2017 we launched our Strategic Plan for 2017-2020 and since then we have been working on the implementation of the strategic priorities contained in the plan. Over the last year we have carried out the following:

 Introduced our 'programme of change' designed to bring about more responsive systems in support of partnership priorities and to augment our role as a strategic partner within the Community Planning Partnership whilst supporting and advocating for South Lanarkshire's Third Sector.

- Identified a new operating structure to allow us to lead in strategic engagement with statutory partners and further establish VASLan as a key interface between Third Sector organisations, local communities and Community Planning Partners.
- Revamped our CRM system database referred to as "EPI" (Engage, Promote, Involve), redesigned the functionality of the Locator tool and refreshed our website.
- As we embed the new operating structure and processes we will continue to provide a coordinated accountable approach to assessing and resourcing emerging need and provide a richer communications platform.

ENGAGE

VASLan's mission to engage with Third Sector organisations is 'To shape, strengthen and serve a strong, vibrant, empowered and inclusive volunteering community and voluntary sector in South Lanarkshire'.

Our commitment to our Third Sector partners is to engage with them across a range of subject matters providing real value in terms of the support provided to new and existing organisations.

ENGAGING VOLUNTEERS

VASLan is committed to promoting the many benefits of volunteering and ensures that anyone who wishes to volunteer is given the opportunity to do so. A range of advice and support is available to potential volunteers to help them find a suitable placement, including a database of volunteering opportunities.





SUPPORTING & DEVELOPING THIRD SECTOR ORGANISATIONS

A primary function of VASLan as the Third Sector Interface for South Lanarkshire is to provide capacity building support to enable Third Sector organisations to be well managed and deliver quality services.

A range of capacity building support was offered to South Lanarkshire's Third Sector during 2017/18 including: start-up advice; understanding common Third Sector legal structures; business planning; finance; governance; policies & procedures; applying for charitable status; identifying potential funding opportunities; drafting funding applications and more.

VASLan facilitates regular **Third Sector Forums** (TSFs). This platform enables effective engagement between the third sector and our strategic partners.

This year 16 forum meetings with a total of 221 attendees have taken place across all 4 localities and have included information and consultation opportunities on a range of upcoming themes and trends such as: autism support information, social prescribing and community justice.

As part of the Third Sector Forum Structure the Third Sector Chief Officer Group met on 11 occasions, addressing issues such as social prescribing, children's services planning and health and social care.



TRAINING

Throughout the year VASLan worked in partnership with a range of external organisations and Third Sector partners to deliver training opportunities, including a 'Business Innovation Workshop' and an 'Introduction to Selling Skills' session. We also delivered sessions on governance, evaluation, Gift Aid, funding and volunteer management. Additionally, eight First Friday Funding surgeries were held along with Bits & Pieces sessions including "Keeping the Lights On".





During 2017/18 VASLan focused on developing a picture of the Third Sector in South Lanarkshire. This picture has evolved to now show the services being delivered by Third Sector organisations and VASLan is actively promoting them.

PROMOTE

Our vision is to ensure 'The quality of community and voluntary action in South Lanarkshire is among the best in Scotland'.

VASLan's role as a strategic partner within the Community Planning Partnership provides a platform across a range of partnership boards to promote, support and advocate for South Lanarkshire's Third Sector. Our revised **EPI database** provides a direct link to **Locator**, ensuring partners from a range of services, communities and individuals have an easily accessible platform to source Third Sector services across South Lanarkshire.

PROMOTING BEST PRACTICE

VASLan significantly improved the online Resource Kit which now provides a vast amount of informative resources to support the Third Sector in achieving best practice goals. The Volunteer Friendly Award is a simple, user-friendly mark of quality signifying excellence in the way organisations manage, support and involve their volunteers. This year we continued to promote and support organisations to achieve the award.

PROMOTING VOLUNTEERING



VASLan continued to promote and administer the **Saltire Awards** in South Lanarkshire, the Scottish Government endorsed scheme recognising the volunteering achievements of young people aged 12-25 years old. In 2017/18 Saltire registrations increased 16% on the previous year with **402** Approach and **292** Ascent level certificates being issued.

VOLUNTEERING AWARDS

Our Volunteer of the Year Awards were held at Hamilton Racecourse during Volunteers' Week 2017 where shortlisted nominees of 5 categories enjoyed an afternoon tea. In total we had 118 nominations across categories which included Young Volunteer of the Year, Long Serving Volunteer, Committee Member of the Year and Volunteer of the Year.



Various partners across South Lanarkshire - including the Health and Social Care Partnership, NHS Lanarkshire Health Improvement, South Lanarkshire Leisure and Culture and South Lanarkshire Health and Social Care Forum - have been actively promoting the VASLan Locator tool to assist in the identification of locally based Third Sector organisations at locality level through the Locality Planning Groups and a range of local activity.

PROMOTING THE SECTOR

VASLan has become more proactive through the increased usage of social media tools and the enhancement of our website to both promote the Third Sector and ensure it is informed.

e-newsletters published with an additional eight special e-newsletters covering topics such as early years, health and social care & social enterprise

New volunteering opportunities advertised through social media, our website and the Volunteer Scotland website

A number of events were also facilitated to enable organisations to promote their work and network, including social enterprise targeted events such as the Christmas Pop-Up Shop. Meet the Funder events were also held on two occasions, enabling organisations to discuss proposals face-toface with funders.





The Locator website www.locator.org.uk originally launched in 2013 was significantly enhanced this year. Locator now allows members of the public, professionals and the Third Sector to search for services using a variety of search criteria e.g. location, service type or desired outcomes such as 'improved mental health' etc.

With 76,000 page views per year, Locator is a vital resource in allowing partners and South Lanarkshire communities to easily identify local Third Sector organisations and services. This year we have continued to promote the tool at partner meetings and events, helping to raise awareness and extend its benefit to those in need. For example, through receiving a presentation on the tool at a multi-agency group that included social work, education, health improvement and leisure and culture. professionals were able to disseminate the information to kinship carers ensuring that they could access information about activities taking place in their localities that were suitable for their children.

> As well as engaging and promoting the Third Sector, VASLan actively encourages organisations to be involved in the decision making process.

INVOLVE

VASLan as a representative body works hard to ensure the Third Sector is informed of and involved in the strategic decision making process. We do this through our:

- on-line services
- e-newsletter
- social media
- website
- locality Third Sector Forum events
- Third Sector Chief Officers Group
- strategic links with the Community Planning Partnership

All of which encourages local organisations and the wider partnership to 'get involved' in supporting and generating new ideas for positive change.

CHILDREN'S SERVICES

VASLan has kept organisations supporting children's services in South Lanarkshire abreast of the changes that have been taking place on the local and national landscape.



Links formed with the National GIRFEC Third Sector Group and the Health and Social Care Alliance provided information on the progress of GIRFEC's "Named Person" Scheme, as well as giving organisations in South Lanarkshire access to tools developed in other areas to help them understand and embed the principles and values of the GIRFEC approach in their work with children and young people.

A mapping of children's services organisations along with partner agencies as part of the Realignment of Children's Services journey revealed an income of over £10.5million from Third Sector organisations operating in South Lanarkshire.

As part of the South Lanarkshire Autism Strategy, VASLan also provided partners with links to a variety of support that could be utilised by families.

CONSULTATIONS & BRIEFINGS

Throughout the year VASLan facilitated, participated in and promoted a range of consultations to ensure the views of South Lanarkshire's Third Sector were represented. These included:

- Police Scotland priorities
- Adult Recognition Award scheme
- Scottish Fire and Rescue Service: New Ways of Working
- Living Wage
- Community involvement in health and social care



With a number of new national policies either introduced or impending, policy briefings were prepared and disseminated to the sector in order to raise awareness, ensure involvement and prevent organisation being left behind. This year briefings covered two significant policies in the Lobbying (Scotland) Act and the new General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR), detailing the implications for the Third Sector and how best to prepare.

HEALTH & SOCIAL CARE



Working together to improve health and wellbeing in the community - with the community

VASLan continues to be a key partner in the South Lanarkshire Health and Social Care Partnership. Although health and social care covers a plethora of activity throughout the whole Third Sector including prescribing opportunities and mechanisms, a major focus for VASLan has been the administration and monitoring Integrated Care Fund investment in the sector. This has resulted in a broad range of funded activities and benefits including:



348 volunteers, 477 members of staff and 1,893 members of the social care issues



6,521 people were supported to maintain their independence through support for safer homes & through supported volunteering



1,247 people were supported or represented housing or benefits



612 people got help for their mental health



6,226 carers received support to the people being cared for

THE MENTORING PROJECT

Evolved from the longstanding Chance 2 Change project, The Mentoring Project was launched in April 2017 and is funded by the Big Lottery Fund and Robertson Trust. The project focuses on improving the mental health and wellbeing of young people aged 16 to 29 living in South Lanarkshire. It pairs young people with volunteer mentors who meet with them regularly, build trust, offer support and guidance and do their best to help with any issues that may be preventing the young person from fulfilling their ambitions. This year:

young people were matched to a trained volunteer mentor or staff member
