### VASLan East Kilbride & Strathaven Locality Strategy 2026–2029

# **Empowering Communities in East Kilbride & Strathaven through Local Networks**

#### **Purpose**

To enable and empower the third sector in East Kilbride and Strathaven to thrive through strong collaboration, sustainable funding, and effective advocacy that ensures community voices influence strategic decision-making.

#### **Vision**

A resilient, connected, and visible third sector that supports compassionate, inclusive, and well-resourced communities across East Kilbride and Strathaven.

#### **Local Context**

East Kilbride and Strathaven represent one of South Lanarkshire's largest and most complex localities, a mix of new-town infrastructure, rural reach, and high population density. Workshop participants described an area rich in community activity yet challenged by fragmented communication, shrinking funding, and transport barriers.

### Key themes emerging from the locality workshops:

- **Transport barriers:** Disconnected bus routes, unaffordable fares, and a lack of community transport prevent residents from accessing services.
- **Volunteer shortages:** Recruitment, retention, and training are major concerns; volunteers often require support themselves.
- **Funding insecurity:** Short-term and inconsistent funding cycles undermine staff continuity and sustainability.
- **Communication gaps:** A lack of centralised information and underused digital tools make it hard for residents and organisations to navigate local support.
- **Infrastructure decline:** Loss of community halls and spaces limits access, particularly for smaller groups and people with additional support needs.
- **Health & wellbeing pressures:** Increasing loneliness, mental-health challenges, and food insecurity, alongside cuts to statutory provision.
- Opportunities: A strong appetite for partnership, shared learning, and local advocacy through the East Kilbride & Strathaven Locality Network.

## **Pillar 1: Locality Network Strength**

**Aim:** Strengthen the East Kilbride & Strathaven Locality Network as a collaborative and trusted platform for partnership, coordination, and shared learning.

**Aim:** Amplify the voice of East Kilbride and Strathaven's third sector, ensuring its expertise shapes local and national policy.

**Aim:** Foster collaboration across organisations and sectors to maximise resources, reduce duplication, and improve outcomes.

# Pillar 4: Communications & Visibility

**Aim:** Enhance communication and visibility of third-sector activity across East Kilbride & Strathaven.

# **Pillar 5: Organisational Capability**

**Aim:** Build resilient and sustainable organisations with skilled people and strong governance.

# Additional Focus: Transport & Health Wellbeing Infrastructure

Transport and access to wellbeing support are defining challenges for East Kilbride and Strathaven. Bus services are fragmented, community transport is under-resourced, and residents struggle to access both physical and mental-health services. There are also growing concerns about food insecurity and isolation among older adults and people leaving hospital (Home from Hospital reestablished).

# **Focus Area 1: Transport and Access**

- Advocate for coordinated community transport across the locality.
- Work with SLC and SPT to explore joint use of council fleet vehicles after hours
- Pilot volunteer driver schemes with expenses reimbursement and shared training.

# Focus Area 2: Health & Wellbeing Resilience

- Support peer befriending, loneliness reduction and mental health projects.
- Promote community food and nutrition initiatives to tackle insecurity.
- Encourage cross-sector collaboration on early intervention and prevention.

- Local Delivery Plan: Developed annually by the East Kilbride & Strathaven Locality Network.
- Monitoring: Quarterly KPI and case-study reporting to VASLan central team.
- Learning Loop: Insights shared across all South Lanarkshire localities.

#### **Review Points:**

- Year 1 (2027): Review engagement and collaboration.
- Year 2 (2028): Evaluate funding and transport outcomes.
- Year 3 (2029): Refresh priorities through community consultation.
